

LAKESIDE PARK COMES TO LIGHT



It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas

Visitors who enter Lakeside Park to view Christmas decorations will see a spectacular moving light show featuring more than 100,000 lights.

For the second year, Nemesis Metals has put together a show that visitors can see and hear from the comfort of their vehicles. This year, the show, featuring trees dancing to six songs, singing chipmunks and about 100 flashing stars, has moved to a small hill at the northwest end of the park at Frazier Drive and Doty Street.

The show runs from 5 p.m. to midnight daily and will end at midnight Jan. 2.

Joe Skelton, owner of Nemesis Metals, handles design and construction for the light show. Dan Robotka is responsible for music and light sequencing. The two are assisted by a number of volunteers.

"It's a very generous gift from Nemesis Metals," Public Works Director Mark Lentz said. "People are raving about how beautiful the park is."
